

CARAVANE OF TRADES

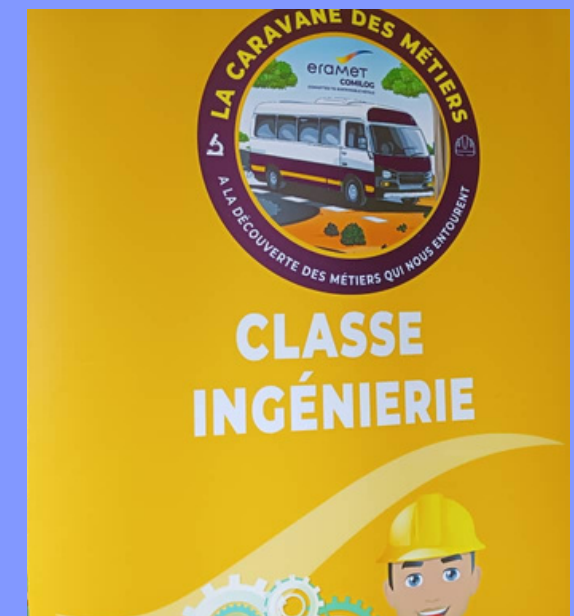
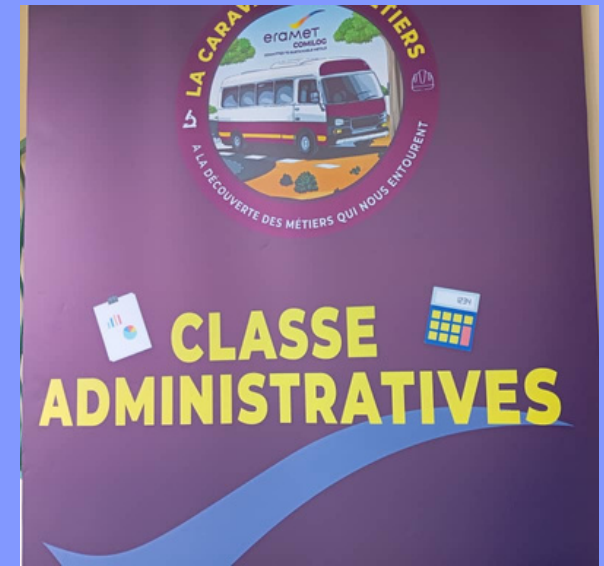
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On Wednesday, November 20, 2024, the Henri Sylvoz high school organized a day dedicated to the search for "BUILDERS" and not "WORKERS".
