link into themes of art, technology, literature, culture, language and history





Art Home to groundbreaking artist Banksy; maybe we'll see him in action...




#### Culture

Wallace and Gromit was created here; it houses award winning muscians such as Massive Attack; even the infamous pirate Captain Blackbeard was a Bristolian!



#### Architecture and Engineering

Isambard Kingdom Brunel, the father of British engineering, was born and lived here. He built the first under-river tunnel: he'd be a hero in Norway.



#### History ... good and bad

Bristol has been a trading port since the Roman era, and has traded in tobacco, cotton and slaves. A voyage to 'discover' North America left Bristol in 1497.



The whole city is a designated a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Language About ten percent of the people in Cardiff speak Welsh (10.5% when we arrive there).


#### The city of castles and coal

Twinned with Hordaland county (just above Rogaland).













Day 1: Sunday 22nd Apríl






