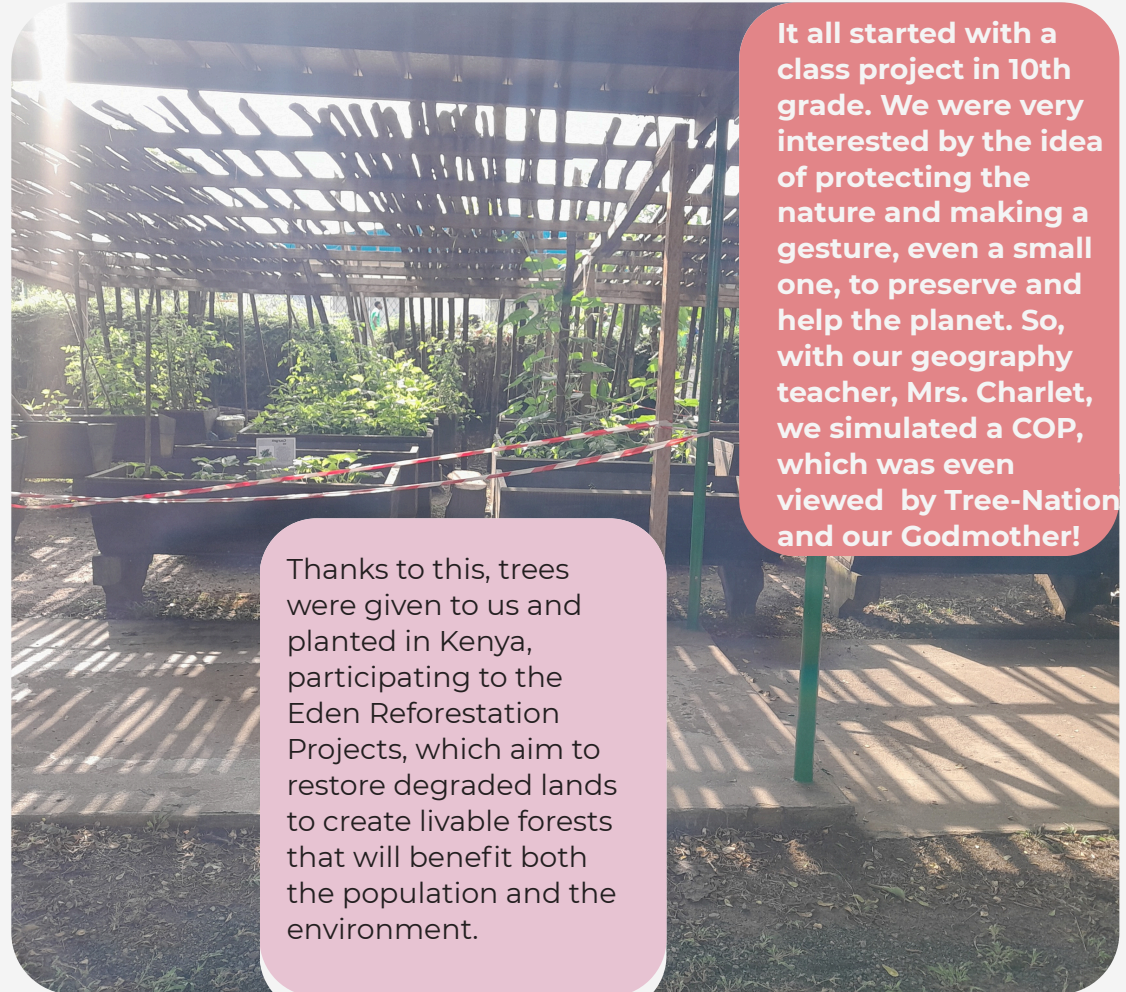

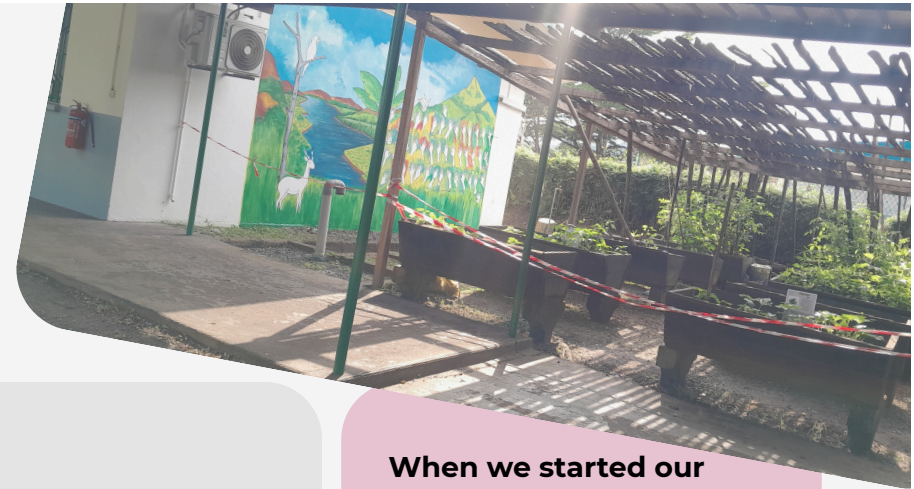
What really touched us is that each tree will bear our name. That's a little over 40 trees; it may not seem like much... but for us, it means a lot.
