Even though they asked for a vote on their independence, Scotland is part of the United Kingdom. Its only land border is with England. Edinburgh is the capital city.





The name 'Edinburgh' derives from the Gaelic 'Dùn Èideann' and the city is affectionately nicknamed Auld Reekie, Scottish for Old Smoky, for the views from the country of the smoke covered Old Town.



Located in on the Firth of Forth's southern shore, Edinburgh is Scotland's most populous city.
